



Important Notice Regarding Underground Buried Gas Line

The City of Mesa owns, operates and maintains the gas piping system up to, and including the meter found outside a home or business. Piping from the gas meter to each gas appliance belongs to the property owner and is their responsibility to maintain. This piping, much like the plumbing and electrical systems, needs to be maintained. This also includes the gas piping to any outdoor appliances such as barbecue grills or pool heaters.

In order to maintain the safest system possible and avoid any potential hazards of corrosion or leakage in this portion of the piping system, the City of Mesa encourages customers to periodically inspect their piping for leaks and corrosion (rust). If an unsafe condition is discovered and repairs are needed, a licensed industry professional can assist in repairing customer piping.
